



Frank Regnante is a graduate of De Witt Clinton High School in the Bronx and a graduate of Siena College, Loudonville, NY with a BS in Economics. Following his graduation from Siena, Frank served overseas for two years in the U.S. Army during the Korean conflict.

Frank has extensive graphics arts, marketing and fundraising experience. Frank's first position was as a sales representative for the James Gray, Inc. printing firm in 1955. He became Sale Manager and initiated the firm's Institutional Graphics Division, which provided colleges and universities communication materials for their alumni and capital fundraising programs. Following a merger, Frank was appointed Executive Vice President of the New Era Companies.

After an 18-year career experience in the printing and graphic arts field, Frank joined the fundraising consulting firm of Community Consulting Service (CCS) to conduct a capital Fundraising campaign for St. Francis Hospital, Roslyn, N.Y. At the conclusion of the campaign in 1973, Frank was offered the position of Vice President for Development and Public Relations. He served in this position for 17-years. It was during this period, he was responsible for branding the Hospital as "The Heart Center" and attracting significant support through the Hospital's fundraising program.

The Foundation strives to address the psychophysiological and socioeconomic needs of Veterans diagnosed as experiencing post-tramatic stress. Through outcomes assessments, the Foundation seeks to continuously advance its program and service offerings.

To access the FREE Manual all Veterans need to do is go to our website - www.opinitfdn.org - and enroll in the Operation-Initiative Foundation Intake Program. This program gives Veterans references to choose the treatments they feel will reduce their symptoms of PTSD.

All intake information is totally confidential and if the Veteran does not have insurance or the resources to afford these treatments then Operation-Initiative Foundation will provide payment for the treatment(s).

Veterans MUST fill out the intake form to be eligible for this program.

Operation-Initiative Foundation, Inc. History

Spring 2010: The seed was planted when Louis Falco, President of the Rotary Club of Glen Cove, invited Louis Catalanotto of the New York Department of Labor as a speaker. His topic was Veterans' employment. A Marine Veteran was in attendance and shared his experience in job seeking with the club. Katherine Gibson, PDG and past president of the Rotary Club of Locust Valley was a guest at that meeting.

Recognizing the very real need within the community, as well as the nation, Louis Falco and Katherine Gibson chose to commit themselves to a project – later named Operation-Initiative Foundation, Inc. — creating a manual to be used as a resource guide of veterans' services.

The category of Employment quickly expanded to services including Welcome Home, Education, Funding and Support, Health and Wellness, Post Traumatic Stress, Housing, Legal and General Services.

The project was recognized on the program and with speakers at the 7250-7260 combined District Conference in Washington, D.C. – 2011. Robert Donno, DG 7250 and Arnold T. Quaranta, DG 7260 – 2010-11, Irving Toffiver, DG 7260 and Gabor Karsai, DG 7250 – 2011-12, and Connie Gevenski, DG 7260 – 2012-13 made contributions to Operation-Initiative Foundation, Inc.

Districts 7250 and 7260 were officially merged July 1, 2013. Gwen Ramage, DG 7255 – 2013-14 continued to support Operation-Initiative Foundation, Inc. Anthony Civitano DG 7255 – 2014-15 made commitments to support Operation-Initiative Foundation, Inc. and a veterans' program during his administration.

Rotary History:

The history of Rotary's commitment to United States Military Veterans is worth reviewing. Paul Harris was a cadet at the Vermont Military Academy where he did well in his studies. Paul's brother Claude died in the service to his country in the Philippines at the turn of the century. During WWI, British Rotary rallied its members and communities to patriotic service: international trade, enlistment, war relief, unemployment and development of local industries. Irish Rotarians formed an Ambulance Division which delivered vehicles for wounded soldiers in France. Scottish Rotarians formed a volunteer battalion sent to the front. Rotary clubs in the United States and Canada donated money and material goods to help refugees, the sick and the fighting forces U.S. clubs in Los Angeles, CA and Akron, OH sent ambulances to France. Rotarians across the country raised \$4 million for the War Camp Community Recreation Fund to provide hot meals and hospitality to deployed military. General John J. "Black Jack" Pershing was a Rotarian. During 1917 and 1918, New York Rotarians established an employment bureau for the discharged soldiers and sailors. The list is virtually endless. Representatives of Rotary International were invited to participate in the burial of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington National Cemetery in 1921.

The illustrated cover of the Rotarian June 1918 emphasizes a post-World War I recognition of America's participation in the War To End All Wars. The cover portrays a Devil Dog Marine reading The Rotarian in the war zone. The photo phase of a continuous picture gives in-depth meaning to Rotary's support of our military in their "time of need."

"If I could plant a Rotary in every community in the world, I

would. If you could plant the spirit of Rotary ... and turn it into practical application, there would not be so much wrong with the human procession." — Warren Harding, U.S. President and Rotarian 1923.

"Thinking of Rotary, I visualize a series of concentric circles which, starting with the smallest and going to the largest, I denominate as the community, national and international influence. I see Rotary International as a generating force of incalculable value." Franklin D. Roosevelt, U.S. President and honorary Rotarian.

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights written by the United Nations in 1948 was based on the resolution from the Rotary Havana Convention in 1940. It called for freedom, justice, truth, sanctity of the pledged word and respect for human rights. Rotarians, individually, played an important role in the formation in 1945 of UNESCO. In April 1945, Rotary was in the forefront of finalizing the United Nations Charter with 23 Rotarian observers who guided agendas, performed translations, suggested wording for resolutions and helped resolve disputes. The 2-1-1 Long Island Call Center is open 8 am to 10 pm 7 days a week and is multi-lingual in more than 200 languages. 2-1-1 call specialists are trained to access caller needs and connect people to available resources quickly and easily – which can prevent problems from growing into crises.

The 2-1-1 Long Island online database is available 24/7 at www.211longisland.org. It features a Keyword Search option, with an Advance Search selection to limit by zip code, as well as two specialty databases for Veteran Resources and Developmental Disability Resources. The homepage offers Special Tabs for information on timely or seasonal topics such as disaster services, severe weather, tax preparation assistance and health insurance. And eleven "Popular Search" tabs quickly bring the user to a pre-sorted list of resources on topics such as domestic violence, child care, substance abuse treatment and more.

Employers Who Hire Veterans Get Tax Breaks

Small Business Tax Credits: Are you a small business with gross receipts not exceeding \$ 1 million dollars or staffing less than 30 full-time employees? If so, did you know you are entitled to a tax credit for expenditures incurred while making your business accessible to individuals with disabilities.

(Title 26, IRS Code, Section 44). This tax credit is available to "eligible small businesses" in the amount of 50 percent of "eligible access expenditures" that exceed \$250.00, but do not exceed \$10,250.00 for a taxable year. This is a yearly tax credit depending on the eligible expenditures. Eligible access expenditures are the amounts paid or incurred by an eligible small business for the purpose of enabling the business to comply with the applicable requirements of the ADA.
