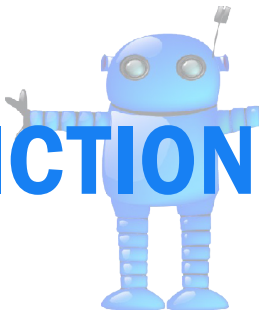
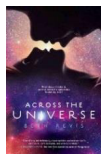

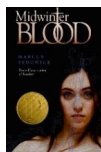
Cinder by Marissa Meyer
